## Quarterly Tribal Gaming Contributions to Arizona Fell 7.5 Percent

PHOENIX — Quarterly tribal contributions from Indian gaming revenue to the state of Arizona decreased 7.5 percent from the same period a year ago, the Arizona Department of Gaming said today.

Arizona tribes' combined contribution for the quarter ended June 30, 2008 was about \$26.0 million, compared to about \$28.1 million in the same quarter a year before.

Under the Arizona Tribal-State Gaming Compact, tribes with casinos contribute one to eight percent of their Class III gross gaming revenue to the state, cities, towns and counties. Gross gaming revenue (also called net win) is the difference between a casino's gaming wins and losses, before casino costs and expenses are deducted. In Arizona, Class III gaming includes slot machines, jackpot poker, blackjack, keno and off-track pari-mutuel betting.

State and local governments use tribal contributions to pay for education, trauma care, wildlife conservation, tourism promotion and other programs. Tribes send contributions to the state Arizona Benefits Fund every three months. Since the Gaming Compact went into effect in 2003, Arizona tribes have contributed more than \$430 million to the state, cities, towns and counties.

Here is how the quarterly tribal contributions in the state Arizona Benefits Fund were distributed:
